

The Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014

The Dogs Exclusion (Central Bedfordshire) Order 2021

The Central Bedfordshire Council hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order comes into force on the twenty eighth day of May 2021.
2. This Order applies to the land specified in the Schedule.
3. This Order shall have effect for a period of three years.

Offence

4.— (1) It is an offence for a person without reasonable excuse—

(a) to do anything that the person is prohibited from doing by a public spaces protection order, or

(b) to fail to comply with a requirement to which the person is subject under a public spaces protection order.

(2) Nothing in this article applies to a person who—

(a) is registered as a blind person in a register compiled under section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948; or

(b) is deaf, in respect of a dog trained by Hearing Dogs for Deaf People (registered charity number 293358) and upon which he relies for assistance; or

(c) has a disability which affects his mobility, manual dexterity, physical co-ordination or ability to lift, carry or otherwise move everyday objects, in respect of a dog trained by a prescribed charity and upon which he relies for assistance.

(3) For the purposes of this article—

(a) a person who habitually has a dog in his possession shall be taken to be in charge of the dog at any time unless at that time some other person is in charge of the dog; and

(b) each of the following is a “prescribed charity”—

(i) Dogs for the Disabled (registered charity number 700454);

(ii) Support Dogs (registered charity number 1088281);

(iii) Canine Partners for Independence (registered charity number 803680).

5. This public spaces protection order prohibits persons from taking a dog onto land to which this Order applies or allowing a dog to remain on land to which this Order applies at any time unless he has reasonable excuse for doing so.

Penalty

6. A person who is guilty of an offence under articles 4 and 5 shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.

SCHEDULE

Any land within Central Bedfordshire which is open to the air (which includes land which is covered but open to the air on at least one side), to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access (with or without payment) and which is:

- (i) an enclosed children's play area,
- (ii) enclosed multi-use games area,
- (iii) education area or areas of designated recreational use at Rushmere Country Park as marked in blue on the attached plan.
